Following on from an email already sent out to parents, I must remind you again that the private road (Rochester Avenue) adjacent to the school gates should not be accessed for any reason – particularly for tying up dogs during drop off and pick up times. "Private roads are roads where no public right of way exists. Residents are solely responsible for any maintenance and repairs" (Highways Act 1980). The owners of the properties are therefore able to maintain their grounds as they see fit (for example weed killers etc.) and we would not want this to put any children or dogs at risk of harm.

Please also ensure that when exiting the school grounds, you are mindful of the entrance to this road and are encouraging all children to cross carefully and safely.
