#### **Statutory Assessments**

Year 6 will be completing the **Key Stage 2 SATs** during the week of **Monday 13**<sup>th</sup> – **Thursday 16**<sup>th</sup> **May**. We will, as always, be offering breakfast during this week. Children should be in school for 8:00am, to allow for enough time to settle in to the day. All tests will begin at 09:15.

Year 4 will be completing the **Multiplication Tables Check** (MTC) between **Monday 3 June and Friday 14 June**. The test is used to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. The children in Year 4 will be completing daily practice tests in preparation, but we also ask that you practice with them at home and encourage them to regularly access Times Table Rock Stars.

## **Behaviour Update**

Using feedback provided by both parents and staff, alongside conversations with children, we have decided to review our current behaviour management systems. We will be using research and most recent DFE guidance to help guide our future decisions on updates and changes that we may make, to ensure that we have both purposeful and effective systems in place.

Following review, we have removed 'Golden time' from each class timetable. However, teachers are still able to use their discretion throughout the week to reward children with additional break times or free play, as they feel appropriate. Children are still receiving the 'Golden Biscuit' when they are chosen for the Golden Award, but this will also be phased out and replaced with what we feel would be more appropriate prices and rewards.

Moving forward, we will be focusing on establishing clear values for our behaviour, that are appropriate for the children we have here at James Brindley and for current society. We want learning to be an incentive in itself, and children to have intrinsic motivation, alongside reward and the understanding of consequence. We will also be 'revamping' our House Team system: making our houses relevant to our context and instilling a sense of collective responsibility and belonging; giving real purpose to house points and shared accountability and ultimately shared reward.

Our Behaviour Policy will be updated and shared with you all in due course, with a clear rationale and information on the systems we will have in place.


## School Drop off & Pick up
